• So if there is any encouragement in Christ, any comfort from love, any participation in the Spirit, any affection and sympathy, ² complete my joy by being of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. ³Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. ⁴Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others.

Philippians – The Epistle of Joy

- Paul expresses joy in the proclamation of the gospel (1:18), in Christ/the Lord (3:1, 4:4), in the day of Christ (2:16)
- In the faith (1:25, 4:1) and financial support (4:10) of the Philippian church they were his "joy and crown" (4:1)

Joy or rejoice 16 times

Not a lot of doctrinal issues to adrdress

plēroō play-ro'-o

Reasons to pursue unity/like-mindedness

- encouragement in Christ
- comfort from love
- participation in the Spirit
- affection and sympathy

RWP **If** (*ei*). Paul uses four conditions in this verse, all of the first class, assuming the condition to be true.

Do we have any encouragement from Christ – by his example, sufferings, faithfulness

Do we have on comfort from his love – he will never leave or forsake, nothing can snatch us out of his hands

Do we have any participation or fellowship with the Spirit who awakens us, guides us bears fruit in our lives, inteceds for us

Koinonia implies intimacy (Thayer)

Thayer splagchnon

Thayer Definition:

- 1) bowels, intestines, (the heart, lungs, liver, etc.)
- 1a) bowels
- 1b) the bowels were regarded as the seat of the more violent passions, such as anger and love; but by the Hebrews as the seat of the tenderer affections, especially kindness, benevolence, compassion; hence our heart (tender mercies, affections, etc.)

- being of the same mind
- having the same love
- being in full accord (united in spirit NASB)
- and of one mind

phroneō fron-eh'-o

2c) to be of the same mind, i.e. agreed together, cherish the same views, be harmonious

Same love for Christ and one another sumpsuchos soom'-psoo-khos
From G4862 and G5590; co-spirited, that is, similar in sentiment: - like-minded.

RWP **Being of one accord** (sunpsuchoi). Late word here for the first time, from sun and $psuch\bar{e}$, harmonious in soul, souls that beat together, in tune with Christ and with each other.

Of one mind (to hen phronountes). "Thinking the one thing." Like clocks that strike at the same moment. Perfect intellectual telepathy. Identity of ideas and harmony of feelings.

Let me see if I can illustrate that. If you have a bag filled with marbles you have a certain unity. You have one bag full of marbles and all those marbles are pushed against each other, packed together. But that which binds them into unity is the container. It's something on the outside that holds them. As soon as you tear the bag, the marbles are everywhere because there's nothing intrinsic or internal to keep them together. It's purely the package they're in, the container.

But on the other hand, if you have a magnet and you put that magnet into some metal shavings, the shavings will all adhere to the magnet. Not because there is an external container but because there's an internal force. And they are pulled to each other because they are all pulled by the same force pulling through each other. And that's how the church is to be, it is not a collection of marbles in the same bag, it is people who are pressed against each other because they're all magnetized by the same force, which is the power of Jesus Christ. That's the internal unity of the church. We are pulled to each other because we are pulled through each other by the power that pulls, which is Christ.

Actions to pursue unity/like-mindedness

Negative

- Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit
- Let each of you look not only to his own interests

Positive

- but in humility count others more significant than yourselves
- but also to the interests of others

Strife (Thayer) eritheia

Thayer Definition:

- 1) electioneering or intriguing for office
- 1a) apparently, in the NT a courting distinction, a desire to put one's self forward, a partisan and fractious spirit which does not disdain low arts

Vain glory (Strong) kenodoxia ken-od-ox-ee'-ah From <u>G2755</u>; empty glorying, that is, self conceit: - vain-glory.

Deeds of the flesh Gal 5

James 3:14-16English Standard Version (ESV)

¹⁴ But if you have bitter jealousy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not boast and be false to the truth. ¹⁵ This is not the wisdom that comes down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, demonic. ¹⁶ For where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there will be disorder and every vile practice.

NAW Pride competitive, humility unifying

MH "There is no greater enemy to Christian love than pride and passion. If we do things in contradiction to our brethren, this is doing them through strife; if we do them through ostentation of ourselves, this is doing them through vain-glory: both are destructive of Christian love and kindle unchristian heats. Christ came to slay all enmities; therefore let there not be among Christians a spirit of opposition. Christ came to humble us, and therefore let there not be among us a spirit of pride"

Unity through humility

• For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. . . ¹⁰ Love one another with brotherly affection.

Outdo one another in showing honor. . . ¹⁶ Live in harmony with one another. Do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly. Never be wise in your own sight. Romans 12:3,10,16

Unity through humility

- I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner wothy of the calling to which you have been called, ² with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, ³ eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. Ephesians 4:1-3 (ESV)
- So, as those who have been chosen of God, holy and beloved, put on a heart of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience; ¹³ bearing with one another, and forgiving each other, whoever has a complaint against anyone; just as the Lord forgave you, so also should you. ¹⁴ Beyond all these things put on love, which is the perfect bond of unity. Colossians 3:12-14 (NASB)

Fulfilling the 2nd Great Commandment Love your neighbor as yourself

- A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. ³⁵ By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." **John 13:34-35**
- Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant ⁵ or rude.
